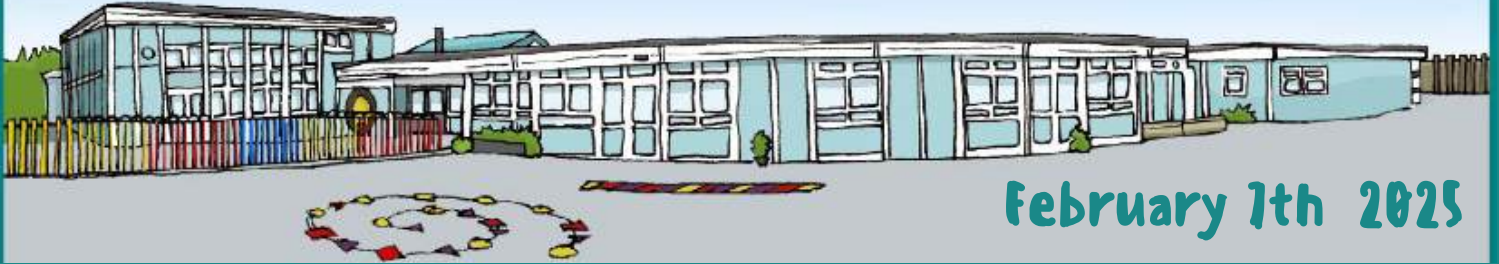

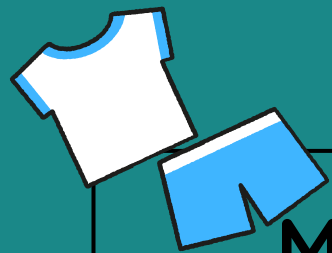

We are currently working with an organisation called When the Adults Change to support parents with behaviour and setting a positive culture at home with your family. We held a virtual session this week, for parents. [To watch the recording click here.](#)

Below is a summary of the strategies for you to try at home.

1. Set clear, concise rules with your family that everyone is expected to follow. Suggested rules are 'Ready, Respectful, Safe'. Discussing and deciding together what these mean with your family is powerful and creates shared ownership and responsibility.
2. Be deliberate in noticing the positive things about your children. Be specific. 'You put all the dishes away today, thank you' 'You got home right on time this afternoon, I appreciate that' 'You did all your homework this evening, I'm proud of you'. You get more of the behaviour you notice the most.
3. Use 'I need you to...' when directing and avoid the 'back and forth'. Start a request with 'I need you to...' Avoid arguments when challenged by using 'I hear that, and I still need you to...' Give your child take up time to complete the request.

Creating a clear, stable and emotionally safe environment is possible when we as the adult ensure we are controlled in our own behaviour and emotional responses.
